Grady Bozeman

Mr. Grady T. Bozeman, age 66 of Jasper, passed away suddenly Thursday, May 10, 2007 in Bluffton, S.C. as the results of a shooting incident.

Bro. Grady's Masonic history is quite extensive. He was a very active man in the following fraternal orders: He entered the Pickens Star Masonic Lodge #220 in February 1969 and became a Master Mason in March 1969. He has served as Master of Pickens Star Lodge; High Priest of Pickens Chapter #28 Royal Arch Masons; Eminent Commander of Amicalola Commandry #41; Past Commander of Arnold D. Troy Commandry; KCCH Scottish Rite Valley of Atlanta; Allied Masonic Degrees; York Rite College; Red Cross of Constantine; Knight Crusader of the Cross; custodian of the uniform work for the Ninth Masonic District; director of work for the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons International. Also, Grand Bodies presided over Worthy Grand Patron Grand Chapter Order of the Eastern Star of Georgia 1982-83; Grand High Priest Grand Chapter of Georgia Royal Arch Masons 1985; Honorary Grand Illustrious Master Grand Council Royal and Select Master of Georgia 2003; Grand Commander Grand Commandry of Georgia 2000. He has served as Worthy Patron of Jasper Chapter #479 Order of the Eastern Star four times, the last being 2005-06.

Organizations that Bro. Grady was presiding over at the time of his death were: KYCH Knights of the York Cross of Honor, Lodge of Perfection Scottish Rite, Order of the Silver Trowel. He held the office of Knight Templar Priest in the KTP; State Appointment at the time of death was: Director of Work for the York Rite Bodies of Georgia, and currently Bro. Grady was in the Grand Line of State Officers holding the position as the Senior Grand Deacon of the Grand Lodge of Georgia.

Survivors include his wife, Barbara Bozeman; sons and daughters-in-law, Raymond and Sandra Quinton, Scott and Janie Quinton and Sean and Brandy Bozeman, all of Jasper, and Michael and June Bozeman, Gainesville; brother, Steve Bozeman, Jasper; sisters and brothers-in-law, Dorothy and Dale Keever, Canton, and Bobbie and James Brooks, York, S.C., and Louise and Clyde Beavers, Hendersonville, Tn. Twelve grandchildren and four great-grandchildren also survive.

The funeral service was held Sunday, May 13 at 2 p.m. from Mt. Zion Baptist Church with Dr. Ben Langley and the Rev. Bill Adams officiating. Interment was in Lake Forest Memorial Park with Pickens Star Lodge #220 conducting the Masonic graveside ceremony. Pallbearers were: Tim Ingram, Brett Massey, Keith Gilbert, Rodney Gibson, Edgar Land and Carlton Wilson. The Grand Lodge officers served as honorary pallbearers along with Bro.
